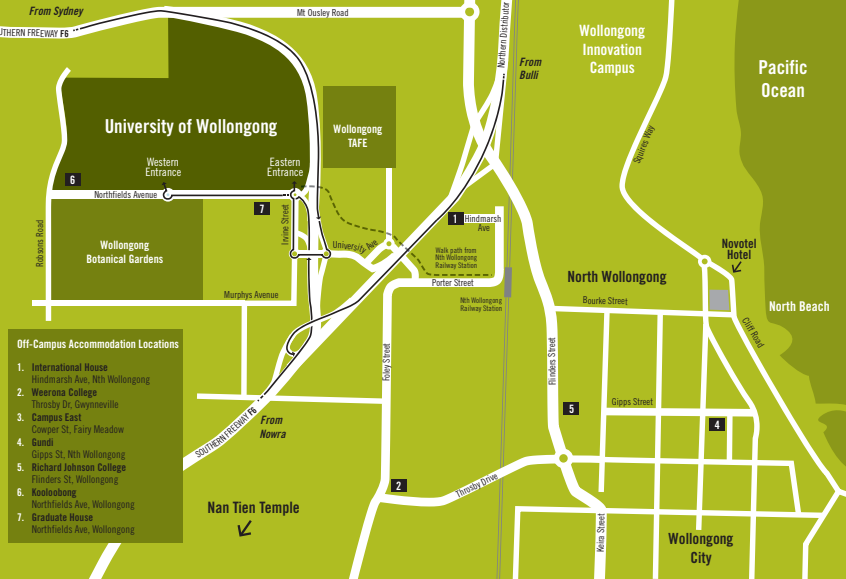

EMPLOYMENT PROSPECTS AND STUDENT SATISFACTION

Latest (2004) figures from the Graduate Careers Council of Australia reveal employment prospects for UOW graduates are more than 10 per cent higher than the national average.

A recent report from the Department of Education, Science and Training measuring undergraduate satisfaction* ranked UOW as number one in the category of full-time employment. The report also showed that UOW has the lowest first-year drop-out rate across public universities in Australia.

FLAGSHIP PROJECTS

- > The establishment of a Graduate Medical School that aims to meet the critical shortage of doctors in regional, rural and remote areas of Australia.
- > The development of a \$300 million Innovation Campus to encourage business relationships with the University through collaborative and inter-related activities. This joint venture partnership with Baulderstone Hornibrook will employ around 5000 people when complete.
