Since graduating from the University of Western Sydney with a Diploma of Teaching, Rob Fembock has worked in several educational institutions for primary aged through to university aged students. In 2005, Rob returned to his studies to complete a Diploma of Outdoor Education and commenced work as a Residential Supervisor (Academic Development) at La Trobe University. During his tenure at La Trobe he designed and implemented student leadership training, supervised RAs and Academic Mentors, and coordinated student orientation.

Prior to La Trobe University, Rob spent a number of years as a teacher and trainer in a range of institutions. At the Reiby Juvenile Justice Centre, Rob worked with 10-16 year olds with behaviour difficulties. From here, he moved to London and undertook not dissimilar work with Havistock High School developing and teaching individual basic literacy and numeracy programs for suspended students. Returning to Australia in 1996 he was again employed by NSW Juvenile Justice as a program coordinator and later as a teacher at Banksia Detention Centre. Gaining qualifications as an accredited workplace trainer and assessor, Rob's career took a slightly different direction. He was employed by West Coast College of TAFE to work with unemployed mutual obligation students referred by CentreLink.
