Criteria:

Applicants for the sponsored Scholarship must meet and address the following criteria:

- o Must be enrolled *full-time* in MEDI603 (Phase 3) of the Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) at the University of Wollongong commencing in July 2011.
- o Applicants must remain enrolled full time for the duration of the scholarship.
- o Must achieve and maintain satisfactory grades for the duration of scholarship.
- o Must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia.
- o Applicants must possess an interest in a career in General Practice.
- o All Applicants will be required to submit a minimum 500, maximum 1000 word essay on "Primary Care in the Community". The essay should focus on the applicant's experience in engaging in the local community and understanding of the unique qualities of General Practice that contribute to primary care in Australia.

- o A brief cover letter and resume and outline of community involvement
- o A photocopy of your academic records

- o An essay (minimum 500, maximum 1000 words) describing your experiences in engaging the local community during your long term rural placement and understanding of the unique qualities of General Practice in this region that contribute to primary care in Australia.
