Gerontology & Rehabilitation Studies

(Graduate Certificate or Masters by Course Work)

A flexible advanced healthcare qualification which meets your needs

Description of Course

The Grad Cert and Masters by Course Work course meet a professional learning need for registered practitioners working with older people and clients with rehabilitation needs.

It is accessible by flexible/ distance mode and focuses on contemporary issues in practice.

Duration

The full-time course can be completed in 1 year and consists of 24 credit points of coursework for a Graduate Certificate and 48 credit points for Masters by Course Work. Part-time, the course can be completed in 2 or 3 years. The course may be commenced in either Autumn or Spring Session.

Advanced Standing

Students who have previously completed appropriate postgraduate subjects may be granted advanced standing towards their degree.

Cost

New students currently pay fees of around \$930 per subject.

Entry Requirements

A professional registration qualification for the Grad Cert and a Bachelors degree for the Masters by Course Work. Articulation from Graduate Certificate into the Masters by Course will be considered if student is successful.

New specialist subjects

- Policy & Practice in the Care of Older People
- Dementia Care Across Settings
- Rehabilitation: Concepts and Practice

Elective subjects (existing)

- To be selected from Schools of Nursing, Midwifery & Indigenous and Health Sciences portfolio of subjects (1 other for Grad Cert and 5 others for Masters by Course Work)

Flexible Delivery

This course focuses on dealing with contemporary issues associated with the effective provision of health care to older people and clients with rehabilitation needs.

The course is delivered through a mixture of online and intensive on campus workshops. However if students prefer they can attend classes on campus and be part of the full time culture of the university.

Full Time

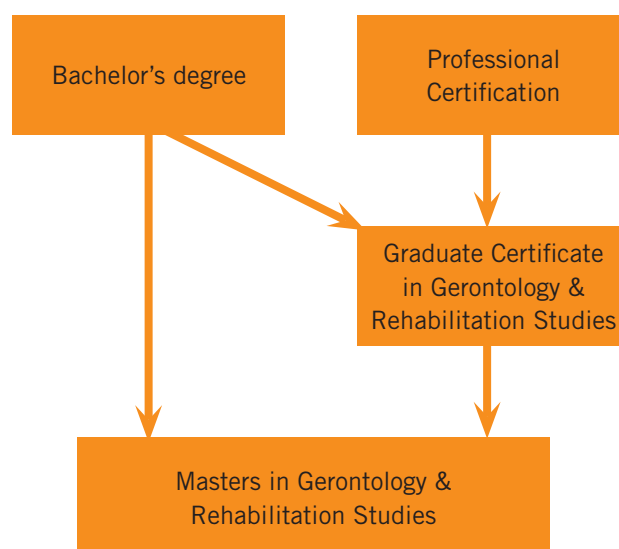
Students complete 24 credit points of coursework (4 subjects) per session.

Part Time

Students complete 12 credit points of coursework (2 subjects) per session.

Mid year enrolments can be accepted.
