Biography

Dr Lindsay Oades, is a husband and father of two boys. Professionally Lindsay is a health, clinical and coaching psychologist who has over 30 refereed journal publications and book chapters, and over 70 international and national conference presentations. Lindsay has attracted a range of competitive research funding consistently over the past eight years- working in teams that have attracted over \$4.3million. Lindsay's research has focussed on applications of goal striving in the area of psychosocial rehabilitation and recovery from chronic disorder, particularly schizophrenia.

This is evidenced by Lindsay's involvement in the development of the Collaborative Recovery Model (CRM) and its training program CRTP, and his involvement in the Stage Model of Recovery and its measurement the Stages of Recovery Instrument (STORI) which has been translated into Japanese, Spanish and French. Lindsay was involved in conducting the first RCT to evaluate the effect of group-based life coaching on wellbeing published in the Journal of Positive Psychology.

Lindsay's work includes the innovative development of a range of methodologies and measurement tools including the CEO-MHS, STORI, Collaborative Goal Technology, Experience Cycle Methodology and Life Journey Enhancement Tools (LifeJET) currently being trialled throughout South Eastern Sydney Illawarra Area Health Service, Mental Health Services.

Prior to his current role, Lindsay worked as Research Coordinator for Illawarra Area Health Service, Mental Health Services, in which he contributed to the development of the Illawarra Institute for Mental Health at the University of Wollongong. In 2004 Lindsay was a Chief Investigator on the Consumer Evaluation of Mental Health Services (CEO-MHS) project, which won a Gold Award at the Australian Mental Health Services conference.

In 2007, Lindsay and colleagues were awarded a Special Judges Award at the Mental Health Services Conference for the contribution to mental health services made by the Collaborative Recovery Model. Lindsay has acted as a reviewer for the Journal of Mental Health and the Australian Journal of Psychology and is currently a reviewer for the International Journal of Coaching and Mentoring, and an ARC Discovery International Reader.

Lindsay has been a Chief Investigator within the High Support stream of the AIMhi NHMRC Partnership grant in Mental Health which is evaluating the effectiveness of recovery-oriented service provision based on the CRM in government and non-government settings for people with persistent and recurring mental illnesses.

Lindsay was recently awarded an Australian Rotary Health Fund grant to evaluate a self-help program for people with schizophrenia that includes the use of MP3 and telephone phone coaching support. Lindsay has also acted as a consultant to train phone based health coaches over several years for a large Australian private health organisation.

Lindsay currently teaches health psychology, positive psychology and psychological assessment at postgraduate and undergraduate level at the University of Wollongong. Lindsay supervises a range of PhD and Masters level research dissertations, with 5 previous successful Doctoral completions.

In addition to Lindsay's research and teaching he has comprehensive management training and experience including an MBA with Distinction with a specialization in Business in Asia and Knowledge Management. In 2006 Lindsay was awarded University of Wollongong Business and Commerce Alumni of the Year Awarded to Graduate who, since graduation, has demonstrated: Leadership; Personal, Professional or Academic Achievement; Innovation; Community Spirit. This included recognition of the mixture of roles Lindsay manages, including being Director of a private company Life Sculpture Pty Ltd which has been profitable since 2000 and primarily his leadership role at International House. Lindsay co-manages International House, a residence of 220 university students from 25 nations.

Lindsay is committed to international friendship and assisted this unit to join the International Houses Worldwide network. Since heading this unit it has financially broken-even for the first time in its history, maintained high levels of student retention and satisfaction, and the new vision of Global Wellbeing was implemented to undergird programming, fundraising, marketing and alumni relations.

Lindsay was awarded the Vice-Chancellor's award for Outstanding Contribution to Teaching and Learning for the contribution that he and the co-manager Alison Hemsley have made to teaching and learning of residents at International House. In 2008 a team headed by Lindsay was awarded a UOW community engagement grant for International House to liaise with SCARF, to assist the settlement of new refugees in the Illawarra.

- k. *Life Journey Evaluation Tools (LifeJET)*. A three module life planning/coaching insttument involving values and strengths clarification (The Camera), life visions (The Photo Album), Goal Setting (The Compass), and action planning (The MAP). (**Oades** & Crowe, 2008).
