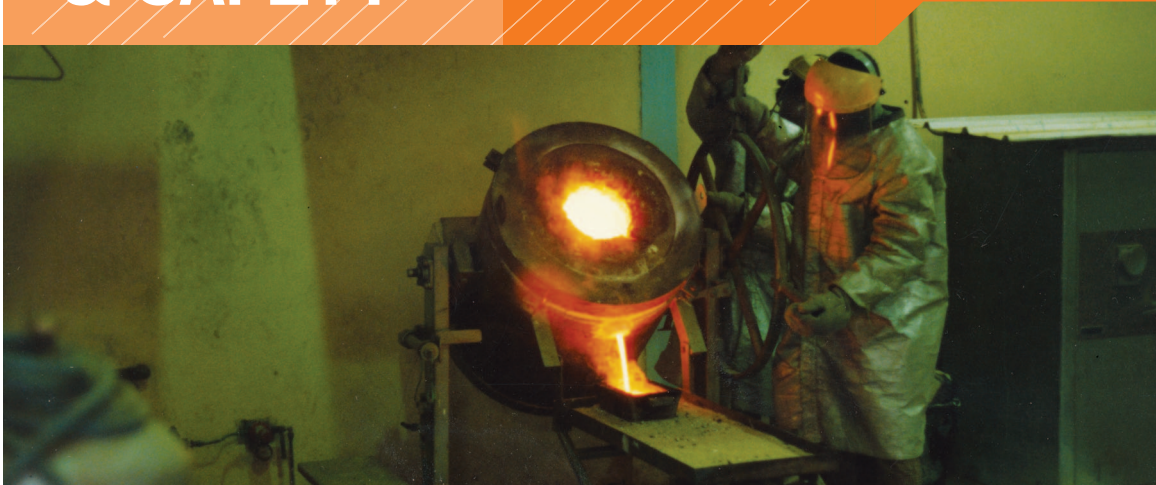

Appropriately qualified Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) professionals are in demand in all types of industry in the developed and developing world.

These professionals come into OHS from a wide range of backgrounds, from tradespeople with many years of industry experience but little or no tertiary education, to graduates of degrees such as Exercise Science, Nursing, Psychology, Chemistry and Engineering.

Their role is primarily the prevention of workplace injury and illness through risk management strategies implemented at the organisation and site level.
