



2009 PARKING

There are changes to parking arrangements for 2009. Please see the new schedule of rates on the reverse side of this sheet, or consult the web page (<http://www.uow.edu.au/about/parking/>)

Pay & Display ticket parking is available in the UniCentre, South-Western and Western Carparks for students, staff and visitors. Parking is also available in the Short-term Parking Station in the Multi-storey Carpark.

Due to construction of the IH&MRI Building the Ovals Carpark parking categories have changed. With the need to reduce traffic movements in this area due to construction activity the Carpark has been designated for UOW permit bays only.

URAC's Field House and under-croft car park should be available in March. Check out URAC's website for more details about how to park at URAC (<http://www.urac.com.au/parking.html>).

Peak Demands in Busy Periods

As in previous years we anticipate that there will be a **high demand for parking** across campus in the early weeks of session. Every year we see students, staff and visitors competing for limited parking in peak periods. Where practicable and to avoid disappointment and delays, we encourage all students, staff and visitors to consider walking, cycling or using buses and trains.

Why not Park and Ride from any local train station to North Wollongong Station and use the **Free Shuttle Bus to Wollongong Campus**.

On your Bike

We encourage students and staff to consider green and healthier alternative transport options, like riding a bicycle to campus. Bike racks are located in strategic locations about the campus. New in 2009 is a secure undercover storage area for push bikes under the Multipurpose Sports Hall. There is a small fee for this, but it comes with access to showers and lockers. Bicycle riders are reminded that a helmet must be worn when riding on and off campus. Riding at night requires riders to have a white headlight and a rear red light for safety.

Carpooling – “Three 4 Free” Parking

We encourage staff and students to carpool. Share the cost of petrol with other students or staff and at the same time reduce your carbon footprint. Parking for cars with 3 or more occupants is free between 8.00am and 3:30pm in the Multi-storey Parking Station (Building 11). See the Parking Attendant as you drive in. If we run out of available spaces in the Parking Station, we will move to allocate more spaces across the campus for this purpose.

IMPORTANT ISSUES

- **Anticipate high demand for parking spaces in Pay & Display ticket bays and the Parking Station**
- Pay & Display parking is restricted to sign-posted bays only in designated carparks.
- Parking in signposted Pay & Display ticket bays in the UniCentre, South-Western and Western Carparks is on a 'first-come first-served' basis, using a Pay & Display ticket purchased from ticket machines and displayed on the vehicle dashboard correct side up.
- We continue to advise that an entry permit does not guarantee a parking space and Pay & Display ticket bays and Parking Station bays are available on a 'first-come first-served' basis.
- UOW entry permit bays are restricted to permit holders only.
- Staff can park and pay to use the Parking Station or the Pay & Display ticket bays.

Penalty Notices

Failure to display a ticket in ticket bays or display a valid permit in permit bays will result in a Penalty Notice being issued to the offending vehicle. Note: Tickets are not valid in UOW permit bays and UOW permits are not valid in ticket bays. Failure to comply with sign posted conditions will result in the issue of a penalty notice processed by NSW State Debt Recovery Office.
