ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN 2010

1.0 Branch Profile

The Illawarra Branch of the AusIMM has one of the most diversified memberships of all Branches and operates in a region with enterprises and education across the full breadth of AusIMM's scope. There are few other AusIMM Branches or Societies that have strengths across the sectors of geology, mining, (both underground and open cut), mineral processing, metal production and processing, metal re-cycling, environmental and the range of commodities and products, coal, industrial minerals, steel, copper, zinc, composites and emerging materials. Thus, the annual program for the Illawarra Branch has been developed to meet as wide a range of interests from all members as possible. Due to the breadth of commodities and sectors, in many ways the Illawarra region and AusIMM Branch members initiate many of the technology innovations and expertise that flow on throughout the Australian mineral industries.

Resulting from these circumstances, the Illawarra AusIMM Branch has very close linkages with the University of Wollongong and TAFE Illawarra, demonstrated by having the highest percentage and most diversified range of student members amongst all AusIMM Branches and academics from all three areas, geology, mining and materials/metallurgy, on the Branch Committee. Whilst the Illawarra branch places a high emphasis on supporting AusIMM student members, education and innovation, it is primarily the wider AusIMM organisation and the minerals industry nationally that are the larger beneficiaries from this work.

Also the program reflects a number key activities that have been undertaken in previous years and are ongoing as a direct involvement of the Illawarra Branch. The success of the activities and future programs are limited only by the involvement and enthusiasm of the members.

The Branch membership would appear to fluctuate between 120 and 130 members annually. In recent times there has been an increase in membership with the number increasing from a membership of 126 in 2006 to 147 in 2009. An indicative break-down of the membership, is given below:

The membership base for the Illawarra Branch covers a wide geographical area including the immediate Illawarra (Shellharbour to Helensburgh), the Southern Highlands (Mittagong, Moss Vale, Bowral, Tahmoor) the South Coast-Shoalhaven area and some people that might reside in Sydney but due to employment opportunities have a direct connection with the Illawarra.



Approximately half of the membership has professional employment within the minerals & mining industries and half in academia (including students). A pleasing feature in recent times has been the rise in student membership. This was brought about in part by an increased interest in the Aus IMM and student membership in Materials Engineering but most significantly by increases in undergraduate enrolments in Mining Engineering at the Wollongong University. This is seen as a direct result of the proactive campaigning to increase the membership via careers based forum with high schools and prospective students.

The strengths of the branch are outlined below:

- immediate close liaison with all aspects of Aus IMM-related industries; including mining (BHP Billiton Illawarra Coal), mineral processing, geosciences, exploration and metallurgy (Blue Scope Steel)
- very strong industry support and sponsorship for Branch activities
- the diverse membership with a significant number of members holding Fellow status
- the high proportion of students (more than one third of the membership)
- the diverse social and technical program with at least one activity per month
- a hard working executive which provides leadership
- a high proportion of income derived from Branch activities
- the annual Coal "200x", the last being Coal 2009, and the Sydney Basin Symposium series of conferences which bring industry participants
- a strong voice at the Annual Congress
- a willingness to take on exceptional activities such as the rewriting of Monograph 12.
- vocational promotion with Student Chapter
- very strong affiliation with the local tertiary institutions, TAFE and the University of Wollongong

Perhaps the most important feature of the membership is the branch has student membership which covers the three disciplines serviced by the Aus IMM – Mining Engineering, Geology/Geosciences and Materials Engineering (Metallurgy). This is a significant point because the Branch does not get a high return for this student membership. It is generally regarded that the Illawarra is a training ground for students, most of whom leave the district when they enter the work force. Thus the Illawarra Branch is laying the foundation for the Aus IMM – encouraging student membership that will provide leverage for other branches when the students enter the workforce.

The main weakness of the Branch, as with most branches and similar professional bases associations, is the inherent lack of member participation as a consequence of distance that has to be covered to come to activities and the workload of members. As well many of the members are contract people who are not on a mining company payroll but work as consultants; this requires many to travel away during week days and for extended periods, thus reducing the ability of this subset of members to attend branch functions.

The Branch has a very strong and active *Mining Heritage Sub-Committee* which has been active over the past few years The sub-committee was successful in winning a special community grant and has been active in collating a wide range of mining information dealing with the history of mining in the Illawarra (such as tracings, photographs, reports) and putting this into an electronic format and data base. However their most significant recent achievement is the completion of a DVD titled "*Beneath Black Skies*" which uses documentary film techniques to portray the history of coal mining in the Illawarra. Direct funding from Aus IMM Central Services, the Illawarra



Branch and local mining companies made this possible with the Aus IMM gaining major recognition for this undertaking.

The annual program has been developed to meet as wide a range of interests from all members as possible and the success of the branch's activities and future programs is limited only by the involvement and enthusiasm of our members. The Chairman's report for the Annual General meeting in 2009 (attached as Appendix 5) summarizes the diverse range of activities undertaken for that year

2.0 Branch Committee & Structure

The Illawarra Branch operates via an elected executive committee which is charged with the role of organising and running the day to day affairs of the branch, facilitating subcommittees with specialised interests, and overall promoting the overall interests of the branch membership at large. The Executive Committee endeavours to attract members to the branch from the four main disciplines/institutions of the local profile – Mining Engineering, Geology, Materials Engineering/Metallurgy and Education. The Branch Committee comprises all of the Branch Executive. The Committee meets monthly to develop social and technical activities with a primary aim of enhancing the skills of the Branch members through information education and networking. The Executive Committee receives minutes of the committee meetings and requires periodic updates, especially where funds have been provided for the committee activities.

The last annual General Meeting was held in April, 2009. The Committee meets monthly with at least ten meetings throughout the year. Special meetings are called when there is extraordinary business to be considered such as this Annual Business Plan and budget.

4.0 Portfolios & Subcommittees

The Illawarra Branch of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy elects an executive which coordinates and organises branch activities. The size of the branch is not sufficiently large enough to permit a portfolio or committee structure. However, the branch has three active subcommittees: Heritage Sub-Committee, Monograph 12 Sub-Committee, Coal 2010 Conference Sub-Committee along with the Wollongong University Student Chapter.

Heritage Sub-Committee

The Heritage Sub-Committee is a very active committee and has attracted community support for its projects as well as support for local historical events such as the Mount Kembla Commemorative week end. During 2009 the major project has been the development and publication of a DVD documenting coal mining history in the Southern Coalfield of New South Wales. More than \$150,000 has been raised or promised with the branch contributing \$5,000 of its own funds. The DVD titled "*Beneath Black Skies*" was completed and successfully launched in August 2009. From all accounts it has been very well received with good sales and a number of local and national promotions to be developed. Considerable effort and personal involvement from the Heritage Sub-Committee has been the core to the success of the DVD.

Monograph 12 Sub-Committee

Coal 2010 Conference Sub-Committee

The Coal 2000 conference series has been organised several time in the past with the 10th conference to be hosted by the University of Wollongong and the Illawarra Branch of the Aus IMM, 11 to 12 February 2010. A subcommittee was set up in 2005 when the Illawarra Branch of the Aus IMM agreed to underwrite the annual Coal 2000 conference series when it is held in Wollongong. Wollongong University Student Chapter

The Illawarra Branch has had the benefit of a very strong and active Student Chapter especially in recent years. They have been actively promoted by the Branch while operating according to their own budget and program. A separate funding and possible costing for activities to be undertaken by the Student Chapter is attached with this Business Plan.

A student initiative carried out this year was for Materials/Metallurgical Engineering students to organise a NSW Industry field-trip, supported by the Sydney and Illawarra AusIMM Brancres, the University of Wollongong METSOC and BlueScope Steel. Sites visited included Penrith Lakes Quarry, One Steel mini-mill at Rooty Hill, One Steel processing at Newcastle, Hydro Aluminium at Kurri, North Parkes mineral processing, Cadia/Ridgeway mineral processing, Clarence Coal Washery at Lithgow and Berrima Cement.

5.0 Marketing

Marketing and the promotion of the AusIMM as a worthwhile professional body is, along with many other initiatives an activity that is integral to the Illawarra Branch. The primary focus is to provide informative, educational and networking opportunities for industry based professionals and thereby directly demonstrate the inherent advantages of being a member of AusIMM and supporting the Illawarra Branch. In addition there is a strategic focus for targeting the students through the Student Chapter to generate direct involvement in a series of activities where members of the branch and tertiary students take part. Activities include:

- Student Chapter students nights which invite young members of the Institute
- Schools night
- Careers days
- NSW Mineral Council dinners
- Promotions at conferences and workshops such as the Coal 200x series of conferences, the annual Sydney Basin Symposium
- Organisation and underwriting excursions such as the minerals processing trips to Western NSW for Materials Engineering/Metallurgy students.
- Visits to Australia Industry World, the nation's largest metallurgical site visit and careers education complex
- Hosting the Applications of Computers & Operations Research to the Minerals Industry (APCOM) Conference in 2011



A key Marketing strategy for 2009 was to build on the success of the 2008 New Leaders Conference and Mining games being held in Wollongong. This represented an ideal opportunity to promote the training and skills development within the industry and particularly the young professionals which make up the human side of the industry. The success of this program gave direct impetus to the Student Chapter and encouraged involvement in the 2009 New Leaders Conference and Mining games.

6.0 Technical Events

The Illawarra branch organises several technical meetings and presentations, conferences, lectures and field trips each year with emphasis on topical activities and events. The two major technical programs continue to be the Coal200X Series of conferences held in February and where ever possible the Sydney Basin Symposium which was held in November. Both activities attract industry, academic and government participants.

The branch endeavours to hold at least one joint technical activity with another technical group, such as the Institute of Engineers Australia, Institute of Quarrying, Coal Preparation Society, Mine Manager's Association and other Aus IMM Branches, such as the Canberra Central West branch with which Illawarra branch co-hosts the annual student's presentation night (with the organization alternating between Illawarra branch and Canberra Central West branch), each year. In 2009 the Illawarra branch organised and hosted this function

The 36th APCOM (Application of Computing in the Mineral Industries) Conference is another opportunity that the Illawarra Branch will have to promote itself and directly encourage mining & minerals Industry professionals to be involved in Aus IMM activities.

The executive of the Illawarra Branch designs and sends out a flyer for each technical and social program. The flyer is sent to all members and to selected members in other branches with the preferred means of communication being by e-mail.

7.0 Social Functions
