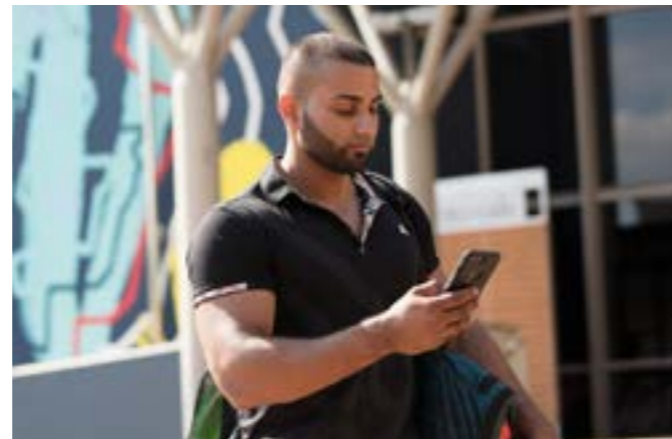

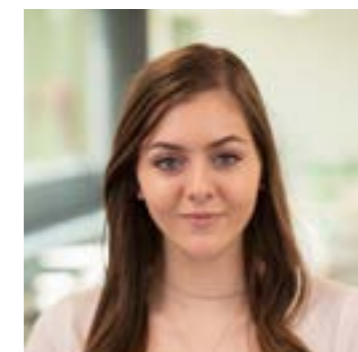

Life in Liverpool

As one of the largest and fastest growing urban areas in Australia, Liverpool offers everything in the way of food, shopping and lifestyle.

Whether your ideal study break is retail therapy, a walk in the park or a picnic by the Georges River, UOW's campus on Moore Street is just a short walk away.

FOOD

You don't need to go far to satisfy your appetite between lectures or tutorials, there are a variety of food outlets on almost every street. Spice up your lunch break with an Indian curry, grab some treats from an Afghani bakery or order some pizza or Thai food. If you prefer to pack some food, make the most of UOW's kitchen facilities on campus.

COFFEE

If you only have a five minute break between classes, you can find a quick caffeine fix from a cafe right at the entrance to UOW. Alternatively, a short walk will take you to numerous cafes including the Blackrose Bar and Cafe where you'll find coffee, Italian food and cocktails or head to Ristretto and Co for a gourmet breakfast, a coffee or a scoop of gelato.

SHOPPING

Liverpool is a city that spoils you for choice with Westfield Shopping Centre, the Macquarie Mall shopping strip and Liverpool Plaza all within a few blocks of your classroom.

ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT

A short train ride down the Georges River will lead you to the Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre, where you can see and learn about art, music and performing. If that's not your style, visit the comic shop, karaoke bar or the Liverpool City Library.

SPORT AND RECREATION

Take a break and visit the Georges River or Lake Moore, nestled beside Liverpool city. As home to two leisure centres, two aquatic centres and numerous parks, riverside walkways, picnic areas and sporting facilities, Liverpool caters for the everyday walker to the focused athlete.



Getting to and around Liverpool

The city of Liverpool has six train lines passing through the area, and boasts one of Sydney's first rapid bus transit-way systems, making it easy for students to travel to and from the UOW South Western Sydney Campus.

TRAIN

The UOW South Western Sydney Campus is only a four-minute walk from Liverpool railway station. This station caters for an average of 22,000 commuters each day, making it one of the busiest on the Sydney rail network. Travel time to central Sydney on the East Hills line is an average of 30 minutes.

Train travel time from Liverpool Campus to:

- Bankstown 27 min
- Campbelltown 23 min
- Wollongong 38 min

With the construction of the Harris Park to Merrylands railway link, Liverpool passengers also have direct railway access to the Western line and centres such as Parramatta, Penrith and the Blue Mountains.

CAR

Liverpool has almost 5000 car parking spaces available in or near the city centre. These include free and low-cost options, short and long stay. For more information visit liverpool.nsw.gov.au

BUS

Liverpool boasts one of Sydney's first rapid bus transit-way systems. The Liverpool to Parramatta bus transit-way is a dedicated 20km bus priority transport route linking the two major centres via the industrial areas of Wetherill Park and Smithfield.

CYCLING

If you choose to cycle to class, Liverpool City Council offers a number of bike racks in its Dewsbury Lane carpark.

FREE COMMUNITY SHUTTLE BUS SERVICE

Liverpool City Council offers a free community shuttle bus, which operates Monday to Friday and is en-route to the UOW SWS Campus.

The community shuttle is an easy method for getting around Liverpool. UOW SWS students do not need a ticket. Just refer to the timetable, look out for the bus and jump on board.

Business information specialists are trained to analyse business problems and find possible IT solutions for these problems. This ranges from running an efficiency audit on a company's information systems through to analysing the effectiveness of a file management system and designing business software applications.

This course is specifically designed to prepare you for a career as a systems analyst or an information systems specialist. As well as having the capability of working in a business environment, graduates can work for government or non-profit organisations.

You will also study key commerce subjects such as accounting and management.

Computer scientists focus on the theoretical foundations and practical approaches to computation and its applications. They design methods and tools and write programs for computer applications. These applications can be in areas such as computer systems to control machinery, information management and big data, applications for mobile devices, stock market trend analysis, game design, visualisation of chemical reactions, neural network design, computational geometry for robot navigation, patient monitoring in hospitals, and much more.

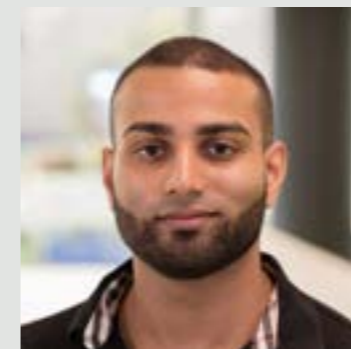

COMING IN 2020*

As part of the University of Wollongong's vision for the South Western Sydney Campus, the University will open a School of Nursing to encourage the next generation of nurses to study, train, work, and undertake research in the Liverpool area.

The need for nurses Australia-wide is growing, especially in expanding regions like Sydney's south west. A growing and ageing population, and an increasing incidence of chronic diseases have made qualified nurses more important than ever to our future. The Western Sydney Nursing Education and Research Centre (WeSNER) will help secure that future.

The proximity of WeSNER to Liverpool Hospital, one of the largest in the Southern Hemisphere, will provide some opportunities to contribute to the Health and Education precinct within Liverpool. About 30 per cent of current employment in Liverpool's city centre is within its broader Health and Education precinct, which has been identified by Liverpool City Council and NSW Government as a key strategic asset and opportunity.

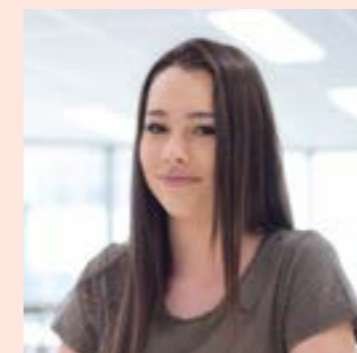

UAC applications will be open in August 2017, with on-time applications closing in late September. Late applications will be accepted, but additional late fees will apply.

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) and International Baccalaureate (IB) cut-offs for UOW courses are listed in the UAC Guide and website, and also in this guide. These cut-offs are based on the 2016 ATAR requirements and should be used as a guideline only. Generally, for admission to UOW, students need to achieve the minimum ATAR score (or equivalent) that applies to their chosen degree.

You are considered a mature age student if you have previously completed the HSC (or equivalent), TAFE or other tertiary studies. Mature age students and non-school leavers can apply directly to UOW.*

UOW recognises secondary qualifications from more than 40 countries and education systems, including GCE A levels, International Baccalaureate and SAT. We can assess students who have completed the equivalent of Australian high school (Year 12) for direct entry to the first year of a Bachelor degree.

Students who have completed an approved Foundation Studies or equivalent program may also be considered for direct entry. If you do not meet the entry requirements for direct entry to your chosen Bachelor program, you may receive an offer to study a pathway program at UOW College (see page 23).

Scholarships

We support people who want to learn

UOW offers more than 200 scholarships every year to students from diverse backgrounds. Some scholarships are designed to reward academic or sporting excellence, while others recognise personal attributes and community contributions. There are also scholarships designed to assist students who would not otherwise be able to study at UOW, to help them overcome financial or social disadvantage to achieve their best.

These scholarships provide financial assistance – allowing students to focus more effectively on their studies, with some also offering opportunities for work-integrated learning programs.

Students are able to hold more than one scholarship at a time. Some scholarships support students throughout the whole degree, while others are for shorter periods, or to cover expenses such as accommodation at UOW Residences. Please refer to uow.edu.au/about/scholarships for information.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE: HECS-HELP

HECS-HELP is a loan scheme that assists CSP students to pay the student contribution amount. You are eligible for HECS-HELP if you are either:

- Enrolled in a Commonwealth Supported Place AND
- An Australian citizen or hold a Permanent Humanitarian Visa OR
- Hold a New Zealand Special Category Visa who meets the long-term residency requirements and will be a resident in Australia for the duration of your unit OR
- Hold a Permanent Humanitarian Visa and will be a resident in Australia for the duration of your unit

If you are eligible for HECS-HELP you will be able to select this option during your enrolment. A HECS-HELP debt is repaid via the Australian Tax Office once your income reaches the minimum threshold for compulsory repayment, which is \$54,869 in 2016–2017.

Costs

Your education is the best investment you will ever make: you're investing in you, your career and your future.

COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACES

All UOW undergraduate places for Australian citizens and holders of an Australian permanent visa (including humanitarian) are Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP), meaning the Australian Government contributes up to three quarters of your tuition fees. The rest, called the student contribution, is up to you. Student contribution amounts vary from year to year. Amounts for one year of full-time study in 2017 are listed below:

– Behavioural Sciences, Social Sciences	\$6,349
– Education	\$6,349
– Foreign Languages, Visual & Performing Arts	\$6,349
– Humanities	\$6,349
– Nursing	\$6,349
– Mathematics, Statistics	\$9,050
– Science	\$9,050
– Computing, Engineering, Health	\$9,050
– Law, Accounting, Administration, Economics, Commerce	\$10,596
– Medicine	\$10,596

These contribution amounts are based on a full-time 48 credit points (cp) year. If you are studying part-time you will pay a proportional amount based on the number of credit points you are enrolled in (e.g. $\frac{3}{4}$ of the full-time amount if you are enrolled in 36cp). Credit points are how we measure student workload for each subject and are a guide to the number of hours per week spent in classes and private study. Most subjects are single session (half-yearly) and are worth 6cp.

Other university costs to consider include textbooks, transport, parking, childcare, accommodation and living costs.
